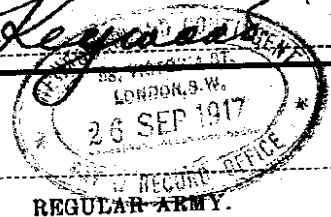

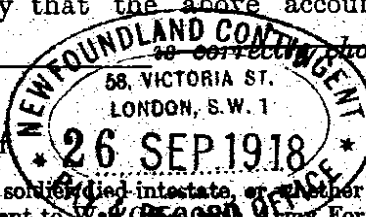



I am asking you if you can tell me any thing about it

from the dead and wanded. I must
tell you I need it as bad as any
one. now I am getting old and
havent any one to help me. so if
you well be so well please to
tell me. if you know. the reason
I cant get. it there are quite a
lots of other getting it. I hope by me
asking you this it wont be any offence
to you. now I am a old man. and
my poor boy ³²²⁰ has wood. went like
a hero and give up his life away
out there. and leave me to battle
