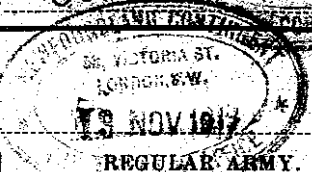
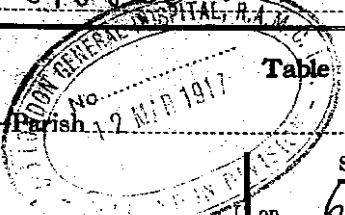

With reference to your letter No. 6188/124, dated June 25th, relative to burial of soldiers of the Newfoundland Contingent, I am directed to inform you that the course suggested should be adopted, i.e. the contractors' bills, supported by the original order of the Colonial authorities, should be sent to the General Officers Commanding concerned, for direct payment by Command Paymasters.

I am to ask you to be good enough to inform this Office what steps are taken to insure that orders to contractors are restricted within reasonable limits, as it is desirable that there should be some understanding as to the scale of fees sanctioned.

I am also instructed to enquire under what authority in the former mode of procedure, a proportion of the cost was borne by Army funds, and with whom that course was arranged.
