

An enquiry has been received in this Branch from the Officer i/c Newfoundland Records concerning the personal effects of the above mentioned (See copy or extract at foot hereof).

In order that a satisfactory reply may be made to the enquiry will you kindly cause the fullest investigations to be made in the matter and submit a report comprising information on the following points.

- (1) There is no trace of any effects having been received here on account of Sgt. Romaine. If none were ~~received~~ recovered is it possible any were buried with him or that owing to the conditions prevailing at the time they could not be removed from his body.
- (2) Whether or not any personal effects were recovered from his pack.
- (3) If effects were recovered and forwarded, of what did they consist, to whom was the parcel addressed, on what date despatched and by what method. If forwarded by registered post, the registered number of the package and the F. P. O. ~~which handed~~ at which handed in should be given.

It would appear that the razor mentioned was forwarded in contravention of G. R. O. 1358. Please take steps to ensure that the provisions of the G. R. O. referred to are observed by all ranks under your Command.


Dear Mrs. Romaine:-
