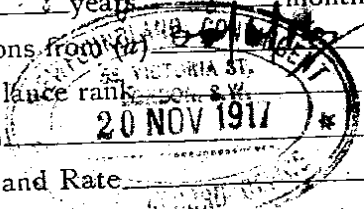

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter undated concerning 2919, Pte. Geo. Rose, who was reported Missing on 14, April, and officially reported "Believed Killed" on 14, Oct.. Nothing further has been heard of this soldier since last reported.

For your information I would point out that the procedure in cases of missing men is that six months after they have been reported Missing if at that time no further news has been obtained concerning them they are posted as Believed Killed on the date in which they are previously reported missing.

Dear Sir:

Lieut. Smith called at this office and made enquiries regarding the estates of the late Ptes. Cecil Rose and George Rose of Great Harbour, and has asked me to inform you as to the circumstances.

I therefore beg to say, that the estate of the late Pte. Cecil Rose (that is, the amount due him up to the date of his death, is at present in the hands of the Minister of Justice and we are awaiting Letters of Administration from him before making payment.

With reference to the estate of the late George Rose, I beg to say that this has not yet been received from London, and we are therefore unable to furnish you with any particulars.

Lieut. Smith also spoke to me regarding the personal Bank accounts of these men which he understood are in one of our City Banks, I may say that this has nothing whatever to do with the military authorities, and in order to obtain this amount, it would be necessary to employ a private solicitor.
