Heart rate at 11.55 P. M. 22nd. May, 1937. He was unconscious and having convulsive movements. On admission to the Ward axillary temperature was 104°. On examination his pulse was too rapid to count. Heart sounds 160. Abdomen presented a large tumour over the bladder region. There was no rigidity or other signs of inflammation. The flanks were clear. The pupils were moderately dilated and some upward movement of the eyeballs. He was frothing at the mouth and the breath had a urinous odour. He gradually sank into a comatose state and died at 1.05 A. M., 22nd. inst. Apparent cause of death:- Heart Failure due to Uraemic Poisoning.

Treatment:- 40 ounces of urine was removed by catheter and an injection of Digitalin and Strychnine was given hypodermically.
