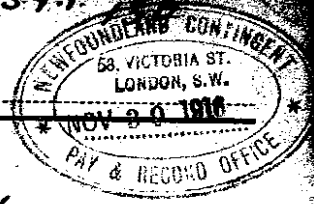

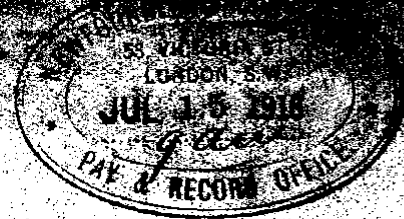

Dear Sir,

It was with extreme regret that the Government received from the Record Office, London, a cablegram, intimating that your dear son, Private Silas Stuckless had died of wounds at Bristol on the 18th instant.

Permit me to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in your sorrow. Our hearts naturally feel the loss of loved ones but it will be no doubt some consolation to you to remember that your gallant boy came forward at the Call of King and Country and gave his life in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. We are proud of our brave lads and also of the noble fathers and mothers, who so unselfishly gave their boys when the Call of Duty came. He has laid down the earthly weapons of his warfare ^{and} he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the glorious Roll of Honour and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. He bravely faced the foe and fought well for his King and Country and when Victory comes and Peace again reigns o'er the earth it will be a pleasant memory for you that in this achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the presence and consolation of the Great Father of us all.

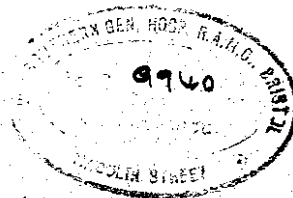



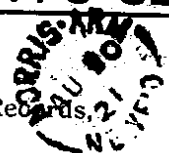

Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of yours of the 31st ultimo, respecting the estate of the late Silas Stuckless, of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, who died of wounds on the 18th day of July, 1916. From the records furnished us by the Department of Militia, we find that the Allottee of this soldier is stated to be "Bank of Montreal in the name of Isaac Stuckless, Father". It would appear from that, that any money belonging to Silas Stuckless up to the time of his death was assigned to his father. If the information respecting the allotment is not in your possession, an application to Major Howley will obtain it. We have no authority to authorize you to pay any amount to Isaac Stuckless. If the money was allotted to him and you are the Trustee, you need no authority from this Department. If it was not allotted to his father, Administration will have to be taken to the soldier's estate. This Department cannot take out Administration under the Soldiers' and Sailors' Wills Act, 1917, unless his estate did not exceed in value the sum of \$500.00 at the date of his death.
