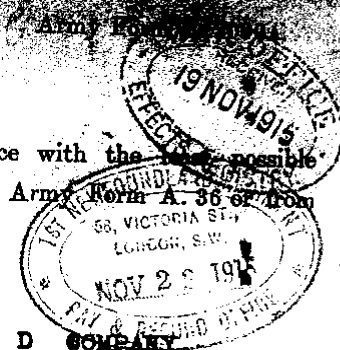



You are the only man we can go to now. You are the head of Newfoundland, and I am a very delicate woman, and now I am not able to work and it would be a great help. Please do your best and send it as quick as possible. I would be very grateful for any amount you could send me. I knew that you were away and I waited with patients till you came back; and I am expecting some every day since it is mine lawfully, and it ought not be hard to get that

I have to inform you with reference thereto that as this soldier made his allotment payable to his grandmother who resides at Dunville, P.B., any Separation Allowance that may be payable can only be claimed by her.

I am forwarding copy of your letter to the Board of Pension Commissioners with a view to their ascertaining if you are eligible for a pension. They will communicate with you direct in this reference

Your letter of Jan. 7th forwarding letter from Mrs. Hannah Walsh of Pt. Verde, P.B., has been duly received.

No. 1065 John Viscount, the soldier on whose account Mrs. Walsh is writing, had been living with his grandmother, Mary Jane Viscount in Dunville, P.B. for seven years prior to his enlistment and was helping to support her. As far as is shown in this Department and in the records of the Pension Board, Pte. Viscount did not consider himself the support of his mother, Mrs. Walsh, in whole or in part. Prior to his enlistment it is stated that he was paying \$20.00 a month to his grandmother, and during his service he left his allotment to his grandmother. On enlistment he stated that his grandmother was his next of kin, although that statement was apparently not correct in view of the fact that Mrs. Walsh is still living. The Pension Board have ruled that Mrs. Viscount, the grandmother, is to receive a pension on account of this soldier of \$30.00 per month for life.

In view of the foregoing it is evident that the grandmother was dependent on this soldier both prior to and during his service with the military forces, and it would seem that Mrs. Walsh has no claim for any payment on his account Mrs. Walsh was informed by this Dept. in April last year that she had no claim for Separation Allowance; and a further letter of hers which was passed to this Department by you in October last, was referred to the Pension Board who were asked to reply to her direct.

It is but natural that you should feel the loss of your loved one, but it may be some consolation to know that he died for his King and his Country, that he had obeyed the call of Duty and, facing the foe, had bravely given his life for the cause of Righteousness and Justice and Truth. Your gallant boy was certainly fighting in a noble cause and his name will be engraved upon the Roll of Honour and his memory be cherished by all his countrymen. While the tears drop and the heart is sad yet it cheers to think that by his noble life and heroic death he has brought nearer the time when Peace and Truth shall again hold sway upon the earth. Through it all you will no doubt be able to look up and realize that he at least has gained the soldier's crown of victory.
