

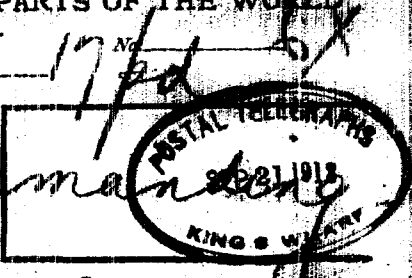

Dear Major Knight:-

I saw Lieut. Waterman today. Thank you for sending him. He has a bad middle ear suppuration on the right side and he has had some anxious symptoms in the way of giddiness. I don't think his ear will get better without the performance of the radical method operation. The only difficulty is that he is anxious to return to St. John's next week with the Battalion. If he were staying in this country so that he could be kept under observation there would be no urgency. However, he is returning to see me on Thursday and then we can decide what is best to be done.

He has also a good deal of nasal obstruction from E hypertrophy and this could be attended to at the same time.
