Military Medal

London Gazette, January 14th, 1918:

Action date, October 9th, 1917 – Broembeek

For gallantry and devotion to duty. As a signaler during the battle for October 9th, 1917, this man worked incessantly under very heavy shell fire all day long laying and repairing wires. He exposed himself to danger but carried on his work regardless of any risk and went out from time to time to repair broken wire. He showed great willingness to do his duty and showed no hesitation whatever in facing a difficult situation.

Bar to Military Medal

London Gazette, May 14th, 1919:

Action Date, October 3rd, 1918 – Ledeghem

During a very heavy counterattack at Ledeghem on the afternoon of October 3rd, 1918 telephone communications were broken. This man volunteered to go out over the lines with total disregard to his own personal safety, re-established the communication from the front line to Battalion and Brigade Headquarters under a very heavy barrage of H.E. and machine gun fire.
