

With reference to your Memorandum of the 24th December, 1917, (No.14416/268/R.& C.) regarding the reports on the abovenemed officer there would appear to be no reason to doubt the report that he died of wounds on the 26th November, 1917, at the St. John's Ambulance Brigade Hospital Etaples.

The report from the Officer Commanding No.48 Casualty Clearing Station, although dated 12th December, 1917, does not show the date on which the transfer to Base took place, and as similar reports from this Casualty Clearing Station show transfers on a date considerably earlier than the date of the report it is practically certain that the transfer of Second-Lieutenant Cluett took place on or before the 26th November, 1917.

The reports from No.48 Casualty Clearing Station are in a very unsatisfactory state and a letter has already been addressed to the Commanding Officer upon the subject. If however, you wish the death of Second-Lieutenant Cluett to be definitely confirmed an enquiry will be sent to the base.






