



I should be glad to hear why these anomalies have occurred, as presumably your Department have time to find out what the respective ranks of Officers are. I prefer, in addressing correspondence to me, you should not use any title, but if you do so, I hope you will use the correct one.



Sir,

Reference conversation of July 16th, I have the honour to bring to your notice the case of Lieutenant (Acting Captain) G.M. Emerson, Royal Newfoundland Regiment. This Officer came to England in November 1915 as Corporal, receiving a Commission on April 15th 1916. He went to France in June 1916 and was wounded in October of the same year.

While in hospital as a result of these wounds certain promotions to the rank of Lieutenant were gazetted, the Officers in question, nine in number, being promoted over Lieut. Emerson's head. As he was in hospital solely on account of wounds received in action he would appear to have suffered considerable hardship in being passed over for promotion, and I would suggest that his bank as Lieutenant be anti dated so as to bring him back to his original position on the list of Officers of the Regiment.

Lieut. Emerson is now commanding a Company in this Battn. with the acting rank of Captain. He is an excellent officer in in every way, very much above the average, and I think the interests of the Regiment would be served by giving him the proposed anti-date which would bring him to the top of the roll of Lieutenants. He is quite fit for promotion on a vacancy for a Captain arising. I understand that his original commission bore the same date as that of Captain Frost.
