Rendell for duty in connection with the establishment of the Militia Department here. You will readily understand that in the formation of said department it was essential to have a senior experienced officer of the Regiment to fill, at least, one of the higher offices. Major Rehdell has been charged with very responsible work in this connection and has been, as the Gazette of Oct. 29th shows, appointed Chief Staff Officer. As a great deal of initial work has yet to be performed, and the experience what will be gained by such an officer will be of very material value for the proper conduct of this Department, I think Major Rendell's services will be required for some little time yet as he is acquiring a thorough grasp of the work and it would be inadvisable to consider a change for at least some time to come. If the details given are insufficient, reference back to the hospital for further information is rendered necessary. The following instructions should therefore be carefully followed in all Colonial cases:

(a) In the case of sickness, the nature and degree should be stated, e.g., enteric, slight.

(b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g., gunshot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

Nore.—These rolls should be forwarded direct to the War Office, Alexandra House, Kingsway, W.C., not later than the day after admission; envelopes to be marked C. 2, Casualties; rolls are not to be telegraphed in advance. The duplicate of the rolls should be sent to the Officer in charge of Records of the Colonial Contingent concerned.

Admissions to the ontlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections should render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists (on these Army Forms) direct to the War Office, and to the Colonial Contingent Record Office concerned.
