I am directed by the Minister of Munitions to acquaint you for the information of the Army Council, that he desires to appoint Captain J.E.J. Fox, 1st Battalion Newfoundland Regiment, to be an Attached Officer at Woolwich under the Munitions Inspection Department.

He appears to be well suited for the duties to be allotted to him and he is at present passed for Home Service only. The Minister will be glad if ~~the~~ the Army Council will approve the transfer of his services. He would be paid by the Ministry.

With reference to W.O. Letter No. 121/F/848, M.S.I.(R) 4, covering a letter dated 4/4/18 from the Ministry of Munitions, which you have forwarded for my consideration, I am not prepared to approve of the transfer of Capt. J.E.J. Fox for continued duty in the Munitions Inspection Department.

Unless, therefore, steps are taken to secure to this (Reserve) Battn. a certain number of experienced officers, it will not be possible to maintain in any degree the standard of efficiency necessary for Drafts proceeding to join the Service Battn. in France.

Whilst it is very much regretted that in view of all the circumstances, application must now be made for Capt. Fox's return to duty, it is hoped that effect may be given thereto as early as possible without undue inconvenience to the Minister of Munitions.

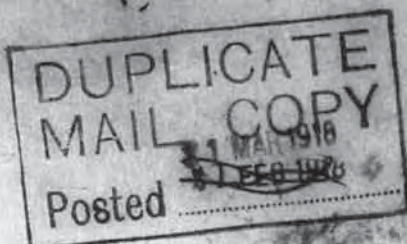

I wrote to Col Rendell some time ago re War Service Gratuity and pension. Can you tell me whether all pensions to those living in this country are payable from your office or from Newfoundland?. The Board allowed me \$25.00 for six months and I received two payments - July and August before I left home. As I understand this allowance is payable in advance, the September "issue" is somewhat overdue, and I shall soon be lying in wait for the October allowance.

Have you received any definite instructions yet regarding W.S.G. for the Starr?. As I told you in a previous letter I was paid mine in a lump sum at the rate of \$5.00 per day, and in my letter to Rendell I claimed for an extra \$1.50 on the assumption that the Newfoundland authorities would adhere to the Canadian rates.

I should be very grateful if you would tell me, in reply, whether whatever "monies" are coming to me will be paid direct from Newfoundland ~~to~~ through your office, and if through the latter channel when I may expect the first instalment.

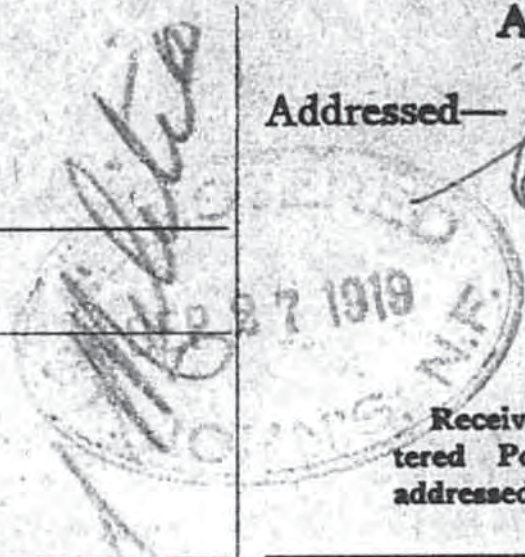

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 8th inst., forwarding your Newfoundland Commission for endorsement. The discrepancies are noted and are receiving immediate attention. As your Commission was issued by the Colonial Secretary's office we are forwarding it to them for correction.

As to the payment of War Service Gratuity, I would advise you that the rate is based on the Canadian rates, and you are receiving \$6.50 per day. The sum of \$274.50 is now being forwarded to you in final payment of this account. Herewith please find the equivalent in a draft for £63.3.6.

1. I would draw your kind attention to the fact that my name has been incorrectly entered. It should read John E. J. Fox and not as stated. My seniority as Second Lieutenant dates from March 29th 1915, according to the Commission which I received from the War Office & also according to Regimental Records. I presume the Newfoundland Commission will therefore be antedated accordingly.
2. I should be glad if you would kindly inform me what action is to be, or has been, taken with regard to the payment of

war service gratuity to officers who have held staff appointments in the Newfoundland Contingent.

On November 11th 1918, I was appointed Demobilization officer with the rank of Staff Captain at the consolidated rate of pay of \$7.50 per day. If, as I understand, the rate of war service gratuity is to be based on Canadian rates, that is to say, daily rate of pay less London Living Allowance, I should receive war service gratuity at \$6.50 per day (\$7.50, daily rate, less \$1.00, L.L.A.). I was paid 183 days pay at \$5.00 per day prior to leaving Newfoundland. If the foregoing assumption is correct, I am entitled to a further payment of \$274.50, i.e. 183 days @ \$1.50. Will you please confirm at your earliest convenience?

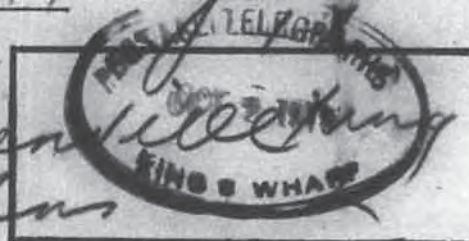

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of Dec. 27th 1917, addressed to Lt. Col. G.W. Whitaker, Commanding 2nd Battalion Royal Newfoundland Regiment, and to inform you that I took over Command of this Battalion on Jan. 26th last, on instructions received from the War Office.

I note that Major Rendell will for the present be retained as Chief Staff Officer, and also that Capt. Fox is not at present required by you; this latter Officer proceeded on Jan. 23rd to take up a staff appointment as Woolwich Arsenal at the direction of the War Office, where his capabilities will no doubt have effective scope.

The Battalion was moved to this station on Jan. 15th, it is now in a Hutment Camp, and has the advantage of being together and having adequate and excellent facilities in the way of training grounds, recreation rooms, bath houses and billiard tables for all ranks.

In the same camp is an Officer Cadet Battalion and a heavy Battery, Artillery, and Signal Section. The camp is about 3 miles from Winchester and within easy access of London.

I have every reason to believe that the new conditions which prevail, will make, for a higher degree of efficiency in everything.

Two hundred men proceed to join the 1st Battalion on Feb. 4th, forty of whom have served overseas before, and fifty more proceed on February 8th.

The last draft received from home is making good progress and it should be ready to join 1st Battalion about the end of April.

It is hoped there may be a continued supply of recruits from Newfoundland to maintain the fighting strength of the Battalion in France.

I hope to be able to write you more fully at a later date, when I have had opportunity to acquaint myself more closely with the Battalion under my command.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 7th inst., having reference to the telegram recalling Major W.F. Rendell for duty in connection with the establishment of the Militia Department here. You will readily understand that in the formation of said department it was essential to have a senior experienced officer of the Regiment to fill, at least, one of the higher offices. Major Rendell has been charged with very responsible work in this connection and has been, as the Gazette of Oct. 29th shows, appointed Chief Staff Officer. As a great deal of initial work has yet to be performed, and the experience that will be gained by such an officer will be of very material value for the proper conduct of this Department, I think Major Rendell's services will be required for some little time yet as he is acquiring a thorough grasp of the work and it would be inadvisable to consider a change for at least some time to come. I understand from Major Rendell that he is quite satisfied to remain here in his present position and, unless

unless his services would be absolutely essential in other directions, it might be concluded that he will continue in his present position.

With regard to Capt. J.E.J. I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of a copy of the "Royal Gazette" of 29th. October 1917, shewing appointments made by the Minister of Militia.

When the telegram recalling Major W.F. Rendell was received, the wording suggested that this Officer was required for temporary service only. His services were of great value to me, and as the senior Major of the Regiment he might reasonably have expected to be appointed to the command of a battalion when a vacancy occurred.

It is, however possible that the Ministry may desire to retain the services of this Officer until a suitable successor can be found. If it should appear desirable that another Officer from this unit be suggested as suitable and available, I should have no hesitation in selecting Capt. J.E.J. Fox, of whose ability I have formed the highest opinion, while his knowledge of Military Administration and his reliability as an adviser have been of the greatest service to me.

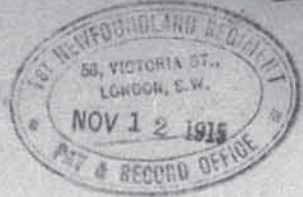
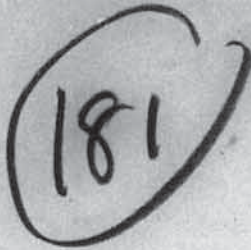
