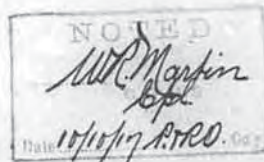

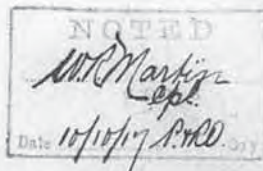



Complains that wound discharges from time to time. This is more frequently than formerly. The longest period the wound has remained healed during the last year was two months. Was in Hospital in April 1931 for three weeks and the wound has broken down twice since.

Left arm. Multiple scars. All healed at present. 4 small recent drainage scars around Elbow. The triceps has been severed and there has been some damage to Deltoid close to insertion. Old fracture of humerus. United. Alignment fairly good. Shortening about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

Movements: Shoulder: Elevation and forward both restricted. 25 somewhat stiff.
Internal rotation - full. slight weakness.
External rotation - almost full slight stiffness.
Backward - full. Circumductions almost full.
There is a subacromial grate and "Click". The "Click" is present also in Right shoulder.

L. Elbow. Flexion reduced 25 Extension reduced 15 .

Complains that wound discharges from time to time. This is more frequently than formerly. The longest period the wound has remained healed during the last year was two months. Was in Hospital in April 1931 for three weeks and the wound has broken down twice since.

Left arm. Multiple scars. All healed at present. 4 small recent drainage scars around Elbow. The triceps has been severed and there has been some damage to Deltoid close to insertion. Old fracture of humerus. United. Alignment fairly good. Shortening about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch.

Movements: Shoulder: Elevation and forward both restricted. 25° somewhat stiff.
Internal rotation - full. slight weakness.
External rotation - almost full slight stiffness.
Backward - full. Circumductions almost full.
There is a subacromial grate and "Click." The "Click" is present also in Right shoulder.

The bearer of this note is, H. H. A. Ross Esq. until very recently a captain in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment. He is making plans to re-establish himself in civil life. Previous to enlistment he had been engaged for seven years in the electrical engineering business and has decided to start out on his own in this class of work. He proposes to make a specialty of an electric plant for both lighting and power purposes for buildings that are remote from electric service.. Such a plant is very little known in Newfoundland to-day and Mr. Ross is of the opinion that the Government could assist him very materially indeed by affording to him an opportunity of placing the plant in one or two of the public buildings in the country such as say, Burin, Placentia, Twillingate, Channel, Fogo or Bonne Bay. Such action on the part of the Government

would not only assist Mr. Ross in the profit that would come out of placing the plant in one or two of these buildings but would assist him further by leading to orders from business concerns in the neighbourhood of the public building in which the plant is placed. I am writing this note at the request of the Committee and I feel sure that you will exercise your undoubted influence on behalf of one who has rendered such gallant and efficient service during the War as has Mr. Ross.

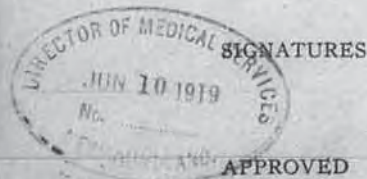

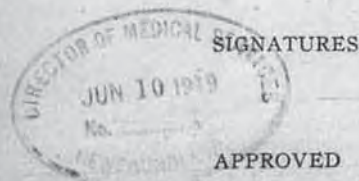

My Dear Ross,

I received your letter some months back, and must apologise for not having answered same sooner. In the meantime many things have happened, amongst which I understand you have abandoned a life of single blessedness, and are now numbered amongst the Benedicts. May I be permitted to convey my heartiest congratulations and to express the wish that your good wife and yourself will enjoy many years of happiness.

We have had the pleasure of seeing the pictures of the operations at Dunkeld, and they are extremely interesting.

Major Sullivan is here and gone again. I believe at present he is in Halifax awaiting transport. He was very fortunate in escaping with his life when the Florisel was lost. He will also be able to tell you of recruiting conditions here. It is almost impossible to get men for the Forestry Companies. They are making so much money at the fishery that they cannot be persuaded that their duty lies across seas.

I understand that the Government intend shortly to bring in some form of conscription.

One thing that has caused considerable trouble is, the sending back of Forestry men on the Medical certificate of the M.O., especially as in some cases there did not appear to be any good Medical reason for

their return. Major Sullivan will be able to explain the various aspects of the matter on his arrival.

Lee Murphy and Watson are here now and will likely remain for some time.

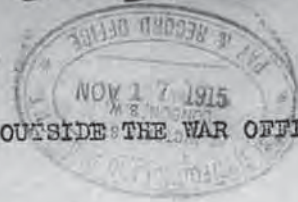
