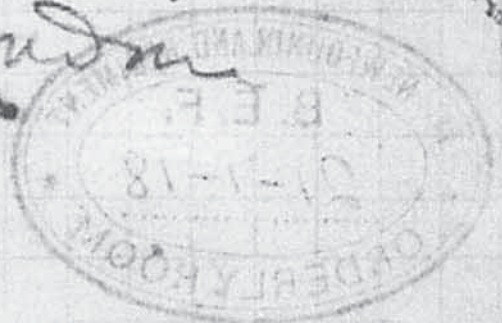

About 24, fair, clean shaven, medium size, 5 ft 7 or 8, home St. John's Newfoundland, was clerk in Stores. At 9.15 a.m. on July 1st at Beaumont Hamel the 1st Newfoundlands went over. Enemy about 350 yards off. After attack Lt. Taylor reported missing. Next morning Lt. Taylor's brother Pte. Taylor of B. Coy. told informant that his brother had been killed at start of the attack.

Dear Sir,

For some time past the Imperial Government have been making enquiries in relation to those men of the First Newfoundland Regiment who have been reported missing since the action of the 1st July. I very much regret to state, however, that from the correspondence which has taken place, a copy of which I enclose, it is evident that none of them are Prisoners of War in Germany, and the authorities are, therefore, reluctantly forced to the conclusion that all these gallant men, whose names are given in the enclosed list, and one of whom was very dear to you, were killed in that fateful action on the 1st of July.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that he, for whom you now mourn, willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honor, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won, and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.

We have received the enclosed report from S. Major H. Williamson, 1759, 1st Newfoundlands, returning to England on hospital ship, who states as follows:-

"Mr. Taylor's body was found when we took Beaumont Hamel in October. He had probably been dead since our unsuccessful attack in July. His papers were taken and sent to the O.C."

Although our Informant was the Sergeant Major we can hardly accept this account as final, as we cannot help thinking that, if what he states is accurate, Mb. Taylor's death would have been officially reported by the War Office before now.

We are, however, sending on this report to the War Office, and if we hear of anything further in the matter will forward the information on to you.

In reference to the alleged finding of the body of Lieut. Taylor, 1st Newfoundland Regt. My information to the representative of the "Red Cross" was to the effect that:— after the capture of Beument Hamel by the British Forces, the rumor was current amongst the men of the Newfoundland Regt. in France, that the bodies of several of our officers & men had been found by the attacking troops, amongst the names mentioned was that of Lieut Taylor. I stated that if this rumor was true, the papers, identification disc, etc. would probably have been forwarded to the O.C. in France & that he would be the best man to supply information on the matter. The term used "when we captured Beument Hamel" was used in a general sense, meaning the British Forces & was never meant to imply that the Newfoundland Regt. took part in that engagement.

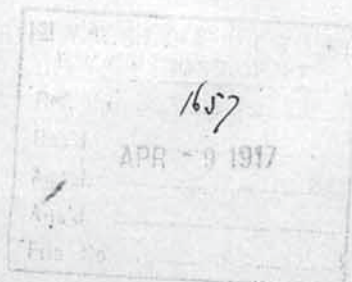

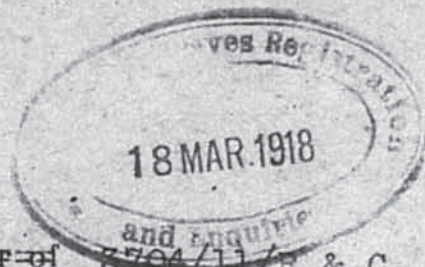

In preparing a new allotment pay sheet, in which I am putting together all the Companies gone forward, and in true alphabetical order, I have just made the discovery that we have been paying two allotments on account of the above party. One, the original allotment, being paid to his mother at the rate of \$20.00 per month to April 30th, and 70¢ per day from May 1st.

The other allotment, to the Bank of Montreal at the rate of 50¢ per day from Feb. 20th.

I am not sure whether it is the intention of having the two payments concurrent, or whether the allotment to the Bank of Montreal is supposed to replace the former allotment to his mother.

Will you kindly advise me to this effect, at your very earliest convenience, so that if either one of the allotments is to be cancelled, I may be able to do so before next pay day, July 7th.
