Was in hospital at Rouen and T.B. were found in sputum. Both Father & Mother had consumption & "frequent haemorrhages". He was in the Great Bazaar at Gallipoli and has been ill ever since.



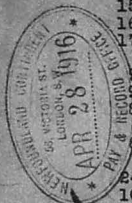
